Sorry to repeat ourselves......but as mentioned in last month's Newsletter Number 40 we have to increase annual subs to R130 per family per year. Reasons quoted were general cost increase, particularly including labour, petrol, herbicide for the vlei etc. We are hoping to extend our spraying and alien removals efforts during the remainder of this summer.

Another option that the Committee has discussed and is, at this point, keen to take up is that of affiliation with BirdLife South Africa. This would give us a voice at regular BLSA Forums along with other clubs with similar interests and concerns and also help with fundraising by virtue of our association with the national body. The BirdLife South Africa logo will be added to the normal letterhead above. We hope to finalize this early in 2016. This however comes at a cost of USD1 (approximately R15) per family member and is in turn paid to BirdLife International and not retained locally. All clubs pay this fee.

This will be the first fee increase in three years and we believe that Wakkerstroom Bird Club represents good value at R130pa and hope that members will continue to support our efforts! Brian Guerin.

Whatsapp? you say,.....read on!

Another initiative, piloted by Graham Spencer, is our new system of reporting AND receiving news quickly of interesting and unusual sightings in our area. He has set up a group (Wakkies Bird Club) on Whatsapp, the free service available on most cell phones these days. All you need to do to join the group is to contact Graham (082 576 2108) and ask to be included in the group. Sightings will appear on your Whatsapp as and when they are received.

A few caveats exist however:

- 1. It is recommended that you don't reply to every message with e.g. Well Done, Thanks, etc. this clogs the system and means also that everybody in the group gets this message which can be irritating and to no real advantage,
- 2. Be aware of the time of day that you send your message, not all of the group wants to hear of Tuluvers even at 5 in the morning,
- 3. Try to be a little selective in the species you report, this will come with exposure to the system!
- 4. There is an option in the settings on your phone within the group to mute the notification tone for the particular group if you wish.
